This session filled up very quickly and, as a result, a future date will be communicated for another session.VP Farrell-Bangerter will return to SEAC next month to provide an update on the AST curriculum for students in CPP.
- Sports Festival Day with Special Olympics Ontario Special Education Services in partnership with Special Olympics Ontario (SOO) is pleased to be holding three Sports Festival Days open to all HDSB elementary students with special needs. This event is organized and run by Special Olympics Ontario and it functions to introduce communities to the Special Olympics movement.
