



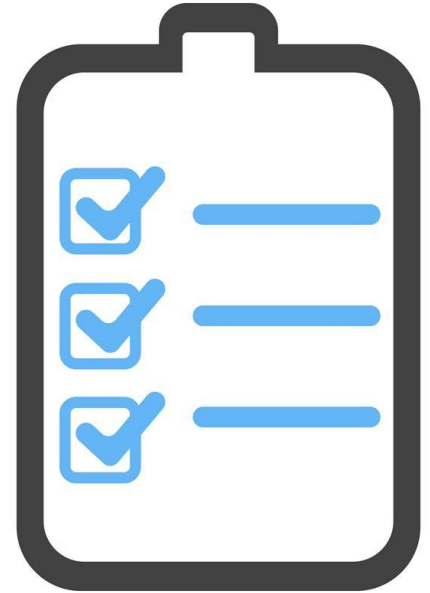

The following means were used to solicit feedback:

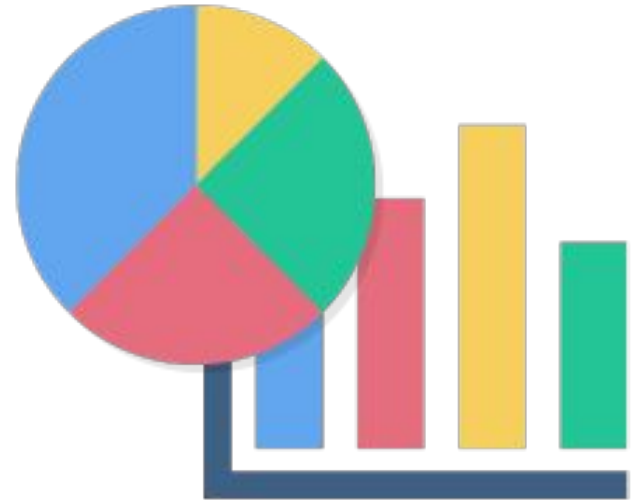
- i. HDSB Social Media: Facebook, Twitter, Instagram

# LTAP Feedback Results

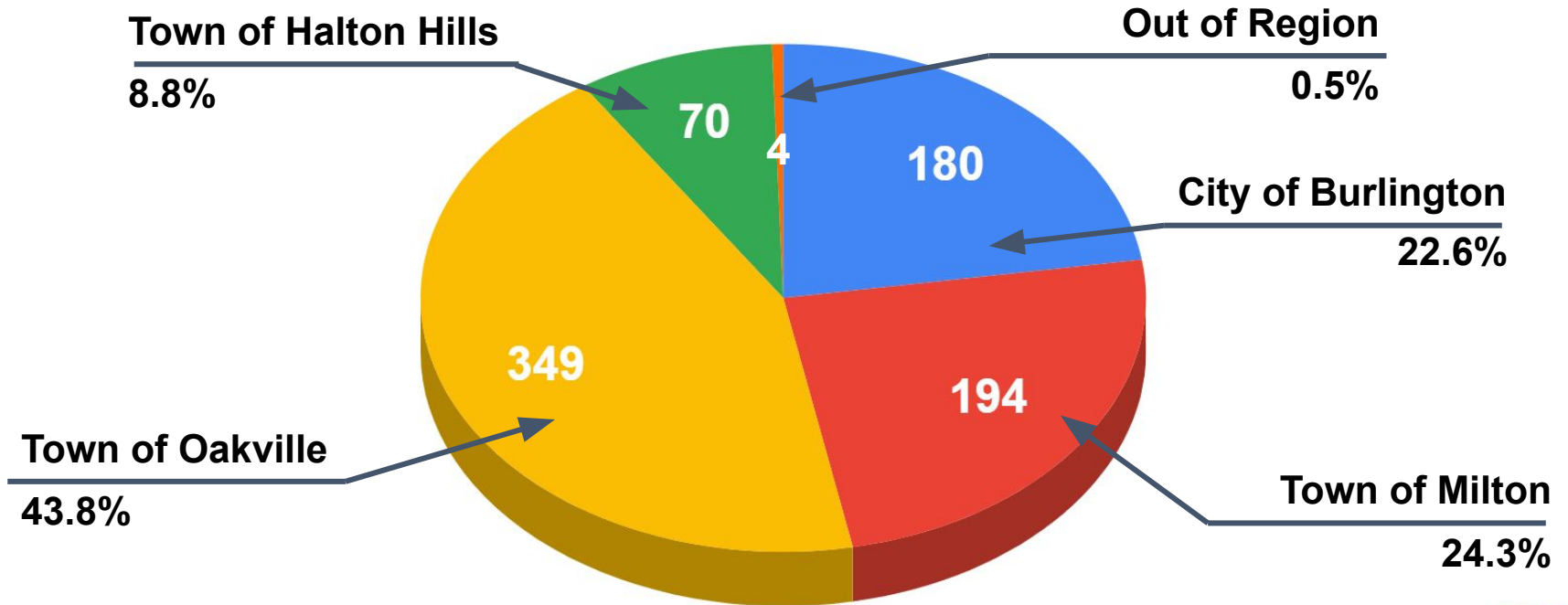
General summary of the feedback:

- i. 797 responses
- ii. Majority in the Town of Oakville
- iii. Almost all respondents have a child in the system
- iv. Main interests were New Capital Projects and Programs
- v. Overutilization (over-capacity) in schools remains a major concern
- vi. Reviews of LTAP mostly positive



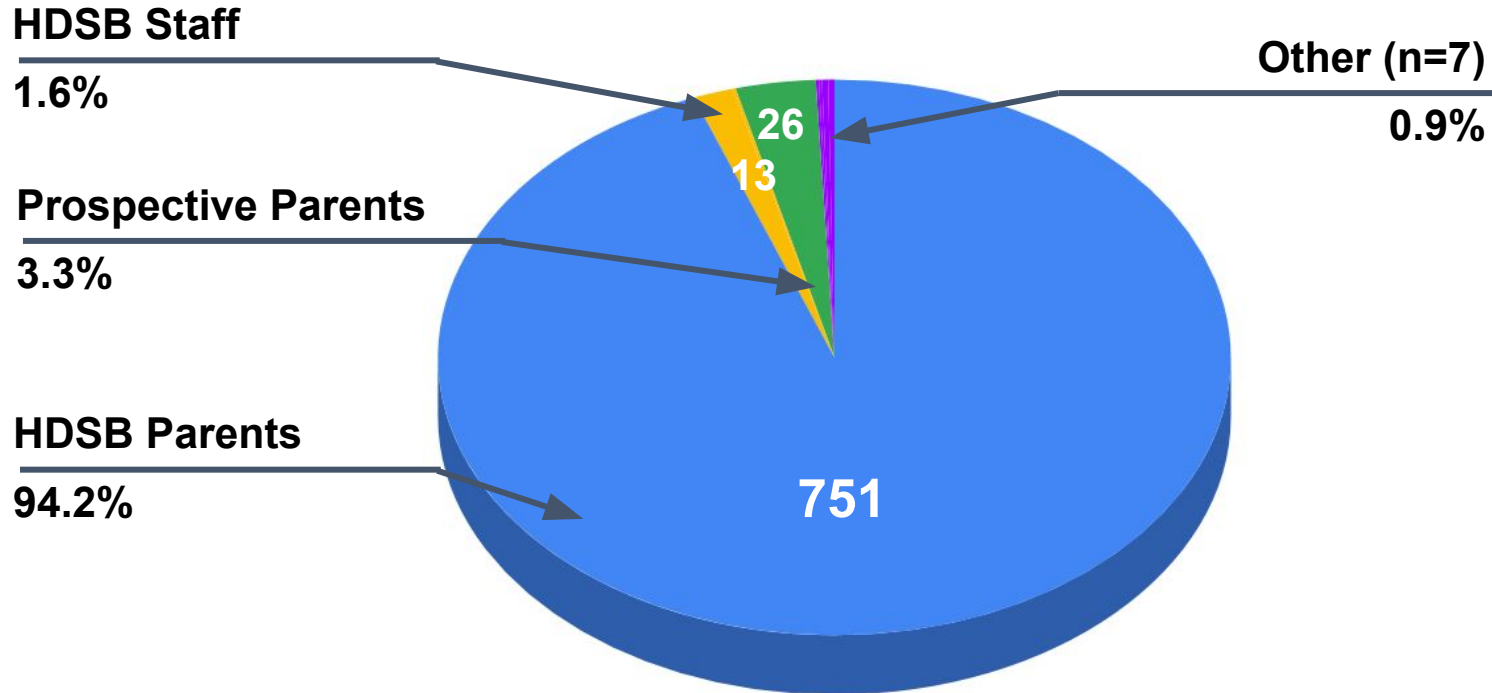
# LTAP Feedback Results

Responses Per Municipality (n=797)



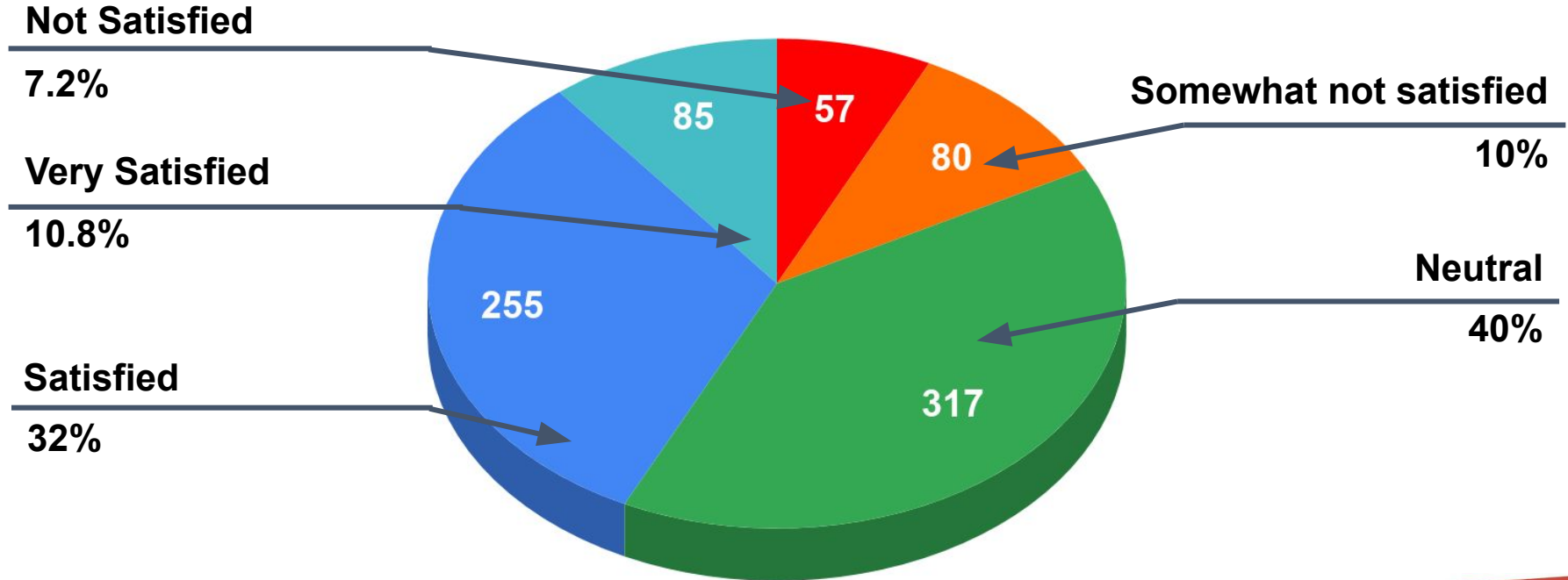
# LTAP Feedback Results

Who is Reading the Document (n=797)



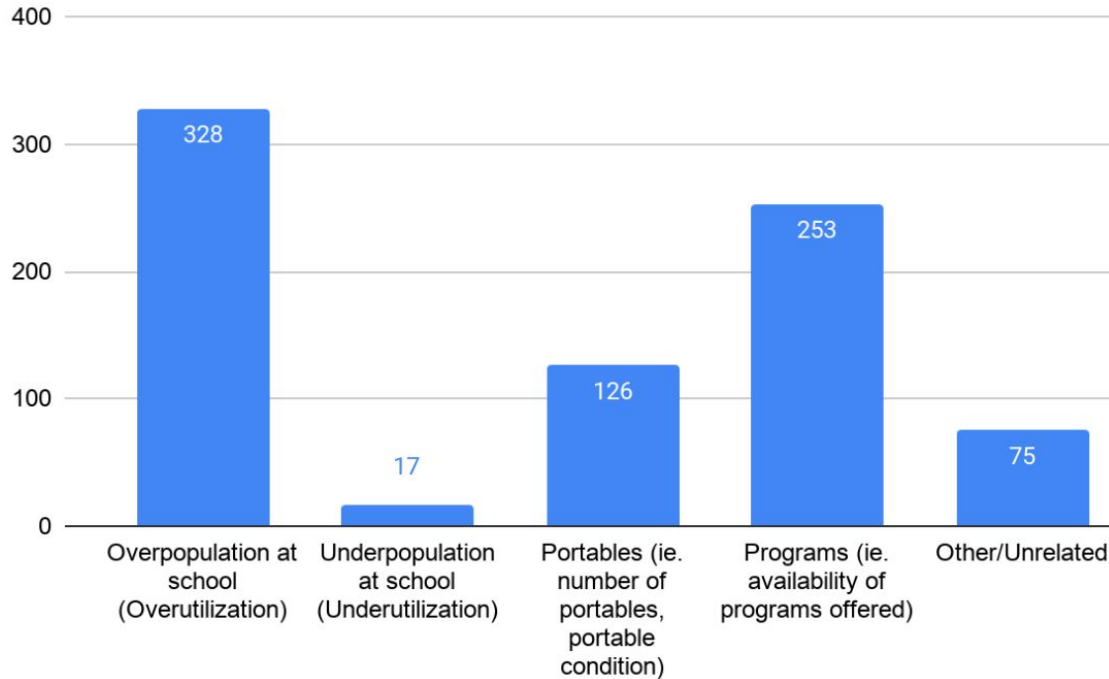

# Themes

## Common themes in the feedback:

Of the 797 responses, 167 responded on what they liked about the LTAP, and 154 responded on what the LTAP could improve on.

Of those responses there are still several that are unrelated to the LTAP.

### Response Themes: Areas of Success

- i. Amount and quality of data and details included (n=31)
- ii. Document is clear and easy to read (n=21)
- iii. Layout and visuals of the document (n=6)
- iv. Program information (n=1).

# Themes

## Common themes in the feedback:

Of the 797 responses, 167 responded on what they liked about the LTAP, and 154 responded on what the LTAP could improve on.

Of those responses there are still several that are unrelated to the LTAP.

### Response Themes: Areas of Improvement

- i. Improve the ease of use with summaries and additional information (n=19).
- ii. LTAP is too large as a document (n=8)
- iii. LTAP not representing the real issues for students (n=5)
- iv. Additional data, accommodation, & program information (n=8)

# Staff Conclusion

## Evolving with Community Views & Perceptions

Main themes for this year with community feedback:

- i. Satisfaction with Board direction and plan
- ii. Concerns regarding over-utilization remain
- iii. Appreciates content of LTAP to explain accommodation picture in Halton
- iv. Enhancements recommended to make LTAP more user friendly moving forward

The LTAP will continue to be a fluid documents that evolves over time to meet changing demands.
