

Purpose of the Review and Objectives


Background:

At the October 21, 2020 Board meeting, HDSB Trustees approved a motion to initiate the process to establish a boundary review to establish the Milton #11 and Milton #12 boundaries (link to report - link to map).



Board Report Resolution:

Be it resolved that the Halton District School Board direct staff to commence a school boundary review for the new Milton #11 ps and Milton #12 ps, which will include schools south of Derry Road in ERA 120 and ERA 121, and the whole of ERA 127 and rural areas south of Britannia; with an expected completion date of no later than June 2021.




Purpose of Boundary Review

The mandate of the Boundary Review Committee is to review the current boundaries for Milton schools and establish a boundary for the new Milton SW #11 and Milton #12 ps.


Viola Desmond PS students are being redirected to other schools north of Louis St. Laurent Blvd for temporary accommodation:

Profile of the Study Area:

The areas under study are bounded by Britannia Rd to the south, P.L. Robertson PS catchment / Louis St. Laurent Blvd to the north, Tremaine Rd to the west and James Snow Pkwy to the east and rural area south of Britannia Rd.



Evaluation Criteria

Criteria to Evaluate Options

Criteria BRC considered while reviewing options included:

Viability of Programs: Can programs be successfully maintained at the school?	Proximity to schools: Are safe walk-to opportunities maximized?
Stable Long Term Boundaries: Is there long term stability and avoid a another boundary change in the short term?	Balance of Enrolments: Is access to programs, resources, extra curricular opportunities being maximized? Can over/under utilization be avoided?
Portable and Portapaks: Is the use of portable classroom minimized?	Transportation: Is this option cost effective for transportation?
Fiscal Responsibility: Does this option avoid unnecessary costs?	Student Experience: Does this option reduce the number of moves? Are cohorts kept together?


Elements of a Zone:

The study area is broken into ten (10) zones.


Zones represent a geographic area, that encompases a community and/or neighbourhood bound by physical features (e.g. roads, creeks).

These zones are combined to create school boundaries for each program under review.


Students that fall within the zones may be *subject to a change* in school, whereas those outside are not subject to change.

How to Read: Option Charts





Option 2 - Discussion Points

Option Overview & BRC Discussion Points:

- 1. Introduces two (2) new dual track schools
 - a. Milton SW#11 ps & Milton SW #12 ps Dual Track schools
 - b. FI starts in Grade 2 with phase in (Small cohort).
- 2. Boundaries align with residential neighbourhoods, which minimizes transportation, and maximizes walking & rolling to school
- Keeps families together between English and French Immersion programs
- 4. Majority of School remain under max-capacity over next 10 years
- 5. Milton SW #11 ps has no relief when reaching maximum capacity in 2026, requiring a future review
- 6. Concerns regarding viability of the FI program over the long-term with number of FI schools in the area
- 7. There is a split Grade 8 cohort in Zone F between Elsie MacGill SS and Craig Kielburger SS (Milton SW #12 ps)









- Concerns with Viola Desmond surpassing max capacity in 2024 by one
 (1) classroom
- 5. Relief for Milton #12 ps with the opening of Milton SE #13 ps in the future, leaving one (1) year for flexibility
- 6. There is a split Grade 8 cohort in Zone F between Elsie MacGill SS and Craig Kielburger SS (Milton SW #12 ps)





Zone F: Additional Details


Characteristics of the Zone:

1. North Area

- a. area would likely to be all non-transported.
- if transported, will require a minimum of two (2) large buses, with the potential for a 3rd bus (if enrolments grows)


2. South Area

a. Entirely transported. This will require approximately five (5) large buses.






Option 7c - Projections

- Zones F north, G, H, I (English/FI)





- Zones D, E, J (English/FI), Zone B (FI)




Option 7c - Projections

- Anne J. MacArthur PS remains above OTG capacity.
- 2. English, FI and SPED projections
- 3. Zone F south (English/FI)
- 4. There currently are no students in this area.

Option 7c - Discussion Points

Option Overview & BRC Discussion Points:

- 1. Introduction of one (1) new dual track school in Boyne
 - a. Milton SW #12 ps introduced as new dual track school
 - FI starts in Grade 2 with phase in.
- 2. Requires that a zone is split between two (2) schools
 - Zone F is split between two school communities to balance enrolment.
 - Zone F is outside of the Boyne community
- 3. Boundaries align with residential neighbourhoods, which minimizes transportation, and maximizes walking & rolling to school
- 4. Maintains enrolment balance over the long-term
- 5. Concerns with Viola Desmond being at max capacity for 2022, 2023, and over max capacity in 2024 by one (1) classroom
- 6. Relief for Milton #12 ps with the opening of Milton SE #13 ps in the future, leaving one (1) year for flexibility
- There is a split Grade 8 cohort in the northern portion of Zone F between Elsie MacGill SS and Craig Kielburger SS (Milton SW #12 ps)




