



Feedback Responses by Area




Program (n=81)

Not in school system: 2




School children attending (if applicable)

There was <u>no feedback</u> received that identified with <u>Rattlesnake Point</u> PS school communities.




Grades of Children

24% of the responses are in Grade 6





Summarized Themes From Feedback:

1. French Immersion

- a. Keeping Fl at "our" home school.
- b. Dislike of removing a program from a school.
- c. "The FI program should remain a priority."
- d. Families have specifically moved to an address for the FI program.

2. Walkability/Distance

- a. Disapproval towards changing a FI area that would be walkable one that would be bussed.
- b. Preference of walkability over program.
- c. Young student and walking distance concern.

3. <u>Portables</u>

- **a**. Importance of keeping the numbers low at the schools.
- b. The number of Tiger Jeet Singh PS portables in each option is still high.

4. <u>Redirections</u>

a. Return kids back to home school.

Feedback Pt. 2

Summarized Themes From Feedback:

1. Legacy Exemption (Grandparenting)

a. Phase out grades 6-8 if the boundaries change.

2. <u>Siblings</u>

a. Averse to some siblings being separated.

3. Mental Health Concerns

- a. Multiple moves.
- b. Experienced multiple boundary reviews (moved once or more already).
- c. Sibling separation.
- d. Travel time.


4. Hawthorne Village PS

- a. All the presented options show little change for the school.
 - i. Concern that the school was ignored.
- b. Influx of large number of students from being a holding school.
