**DEFINITIONS:** 

School Board(s) and Board(s): refers to district school boards and school authorities.

Parent(s): refers to parent(s) and guardian(s).

**Period of Instruction:** refers to the period of time, including the beginning and end dates, during which instruction in Human Development and Sexual Health during health and physical education classes is delivered. This period could extend over several days or weeks, depending on individual schools' calendars and teachers' lesson plans.

**Unforeseen Event:** refers to an event that impairs a school's ability to administer the "period of instruction".

# **INTENDED PURPOSE:**

The Halton District School Board recognizes that the Health and Physical Education curriculum promotes the healthy development and overall well-being of all students. The Board recognizes that the curriculum does not replace the role of parents as the primary educators of their children with respect to learning about values, appropriate behaviour, and ethno-cultural, spiritual, and personal beliefs and traditions.

The purpose of this procedure is to outline the process for exemption from instruction related to the Human Development and Sexual Health expectations found in Strand D-Healthy Living of *The Ontario Curriculum: Health and Physical Education, Grades 1-8, 2019.* Students will not be exempted from instruction related to other expectations in the Grade 1-8 Health and Physical Education curriculum or related to expectations in other curriculum subjects. In alignment with the HDSB Equity and Inclusive Education Policy, references to human development and sexual health made by teachers, board staff, or students outside the intentional teaching of content related to the Human Development and Sexual Health expectations are not included in the exemption procedure.

## **Notice and Communications**

- Parents/Guardians can request that their child(ren) be exempted from instruction related to the
  Human Development and Sexual Health expectations by completing and returning an exemption
  form for each child a minimum of five days prior to the period of instruction. Parents are informed
  at least twenty school days before the start of the period of instruction related to the Human
  Development and Sexual Health expectations.
- Exemptions are limited to instruction related to all the Human Development and Sexual Health
  expectations found in Strand D Healthy Living of The Ontario Curriculum: Health and Physical
  Education, Grades 1-8, 2019, and not for instruction related to selected expectations or groups
  of expectations. Appendix A provides a list of the Human Development and Sexual Health
  expectations by grade.

- Students will not be exempted from instruction related to any other expectations in this curriculum or related to expectations in other curriculum subjects.
- In the case of an unforeseen event, the school has the authority to move the period of instruction to a later date in the school year and will give notice to parents as soon as reasonably possible.
- References to human development and sexual health made by teachers, Board staff, or students
  outside the intentional teaching of content related to the Human Development and Sexual Health
  expectations are not included in the exemption procedure.
- Assessment for students will be based on expectations covered, excluding the expectations approved for exemption.
- There will be no assessment, evaluation, or reporting of exempted students' achievement of Human Development and Sexual Health expectations in their particular grade. Exempted students' reported achievement in health and physical education will be determined on the basis of the overall expectations in the Healthy Living strand of the curriculum including, Healthy Eating, Personal Safety and Injury Prevention, Substance Use, Addiction and Related Behaviours, and Mental Health Literacy.

# Process For Exemption Requests-Roles and Responsibilities

### School Administration:

- works in partnership with teachers and parents to provide support for the successful implementation of the health and physical education curriculum by emphasizing the importance of the curriculum within the framework of a healthy, safe, inclusive, and accepting school;
- provides parents/guardians with access to information regarding the Healthy Living strand which includes a list of all Human Development and Sexual Health expectations by grade, and the Exemption Request Form;
- determines activities during the exemption period which will be at the discretion of the principal in partnership with the teacher;
- ensures parent(s) receive an acknowledgement of receipt of their request for exemption;
- makes the final decision about whether to accept or reject a request for an exemption that does not fall within the parameters set out in this Administrative Procedure; and,
- implements the parent request for student supervision at the school, when possible, **based on student supervision demands in the school.**
- If the supervision option selected by the parent/guardian is not possible because of the supervision demands at the school, the school administration will notify the parents/guardians and request that another option is selected.

#### Teachers:

- use appropriate and effective teaching strategies to help students achieve the health and physical education curriculum expectations;
- engage in professional development and training opportunities to support effective delivery of the curriculum:
- notify parents at least twenty school days before the start of the period of instruction related to the Human Development and Sexual Health expectations using the HDSB standard letter
- inform parents as soon as possible when the period of instruction related to Human Development and Sexual Health has been moved to another date due to an unforeseen event; and,

 communicate with parents about what their children are learning, and make supporting documents for the Human Development and Sexual Health expectations available to parents who request them.

#### Parents/Guardians:

- become familiar with the Health and Physical Education curriculum to gain understanding of what is being taught in each grade and what their child/children is/are expected to learn throughout the school year;
- discuss their child/children's learning with them, communicate with their child/children's teachers for all matters relating to Healthy Living; and,
- provide a written request for a child to be exempted from instruction related to the Human Development and Sexual Health expectations at the least five (5) school days before the start of the period of instruction. An exemption request made verbally, by telephone or email and an application not bearing the parent(s) signature will not be accepted.
- make an annual application if they wish to exempt their child/children from the expectations related to Human Development and Sexual Health in Strand D of *The Ontario Curriculum: Health and Physical Education, Grades 1-8, 2019*, by completing the form (Appendix B) and sending it to the school no later than five (5) days before the beginning of the period of instruction.

## Supervision of Exempted Students

- Student Safety and well-being are primary considerations when creating supervision plans.
- Parents/Guardians should indicate a preferred choice for student supervision on the Request For Exemption Form. (Appendix B)
- School Administration will endeavour to honour the preferred choice for supervision requested by parents/guardians.
- School Administration will examine the student supervision needs at the school and the
  availability of supervising staff prior to responding to parents/guardians requests when the
  preferred choice is for students to leave the classroom and remain in the school under staff
  supervision.
- If the parents/guardians preferred choice for supervision is not possible because of the supervision demands at the school, the school administration will request that the parent/guardian select another option for supervision.
