- Meetings are open to the public.

Why A Boundary Review?


At the September 18, 2019 Board meeting, HDSB Trustees approved a motion to initiate the process to establish a boundary review for the new Milton HS.

Be it resolved that the Halton District School Board direct staff to recommence a school boundary review for the new Milton SW #1 high school, which will include schools in SRA 101, SRA 104 and SRA 105; with an expected completion date of no later than June 2020.


Purpose of Boundary Review

 The mandate of this Boundary Review Committee is to review the current boundaries for Milton District High School, Craig Kielburger High School and Dr. Frank Hayden High School and establish a boundary for the new Milton High School.

Steering Committee Mandate

A Boundary Review Steering Committee is established to lead the school boundary review process.

- Determine and communicate which schools are part of the boundary review process
- Generate the initial boundary options for consideration by a larger BRC
- On behalf of the BRC, recommend preferred option(s) to Administrative Council and the Director of Education
- Make the determination as to which consultation process pathway will be utilized. The options are:
 - consult with the community through Public Information Meetings regarding the Boundary Review Committee's preferred option(s); OR
 - inform the community of the recommended option(s)

Role of Boundary Review Committee

The **BRC** is established to examine the initial options generated by the **Boundary Review Steering Committee** and to have the opportunity to give feedback.

- Work collaboratively to examine the initial boundary options generated by the BSRC;
- Provide detailed feedback on the initial options, request modifications to initial options, or suggest additional options;
- Over the course of a number of working meetings and based upon a set of agreed upon criteria, the BRC will arrive at one or more preferred options;
- Final recommendations will be developed through a consensus process;
- The preferred option(s) are then submitted to the Steering Committee to be considered for recommendation to Administrative Council and the Director;
- Parent representatives speak on behalf of all students, regardless of school, program, or grade;
- Staff's role on the committee is as a resource to respond to inquiries and to provide committee members with the data and administrative experience required to assess options.

Boundary Review Process

STEP 1 and 2

Director requests approval of Trustees to initiate a boundary review The BRSC consisting of Board staff and Trustees review enrolments, school capacities and programs. Initial boundary options are generated and meeting schedule is established.

STEP 3 and 4

Public announcement of boundary review (November 29, 2019 - message sent to all Milton schools, Kilbride PS and Dr. F. Hayden HS). **Boundary Review Committee** (**BRC**) established, consisting of members of the **BRSC** and representatives from the affected school communities. Examine initial options generated by the **BSRC**, offer suggestions, revisions to initial options or suggest new options.

STEP 5

Present preferred options to the community. After public consultation on March 26, **BRC** considers input from community and reviews options to be submitted to the **BRSC**. **BRSC** receives feedback from **BRC**, together with community input and make possible revisions to the recommendation(s).

STEP 6

BSRC makes recommendation(s) to the Director. The Superintendent responsible for the Boundary Review Steering Committee will write a report with the recommended option(s). The Director shares the report along with the Director's recommendation(s) with the Board. Delegations to the Board occur within the timelines for the boundary review process. **Board of Trustees make the final decision.**

STEP 7

The Integration Committee will plan for and implement the positive integration of students and staff affected by the boundary decision and relocation into their new school environment. The Family of Schools Superintendent of Education would act as the Chair of the Integration Committee

BRC Product Goals

The **BRC** is established to examine the initial options generated by the **Boundary Review Steering Committee** and to have the opportunity to give feedback. The **BRC** will:

- use criteria to measure the impact and effectiveness of boundary options
- review the options generated by the BRSC and will offer suggestions/revisions or suggest new options to be considered

BRC Norms

Norms for Boundary Review Committee Meetings

The following norms should be considered for use during Boundary Review Meetings. The Boundary Review Committee may revise or expand

- 1. Recognize individual views and beliefs.
- 2. Balance advocacy for a position with inquiry to understand another point of view.
- 3. Communicate ideas positively be hard on the issues but soft on the people.
- 4. Trust the intentions and integrity of others.
- 5. Engage in a collaborative process.
- 6. Build a safe and inclusive "risk-free" environment.
- 7. The public may attend the meetings, (including Super Council Representatives) but can only observe the proceedings and not participate.

The Boundary Review Committee Will Develop a Shortlist of Criteria to Measure Impact & Effectiveness of Boundary Options

Possible criteria could include but is not limited to:

- **Viability of Program** How many students are required to offer and maintain program in an educationally sound and fiscally responsible way?
- **Proximity to schools** Are opportunities for walk-to schools being maximized, school routes safe, and natural boundaries incorporated into the proposed options?
- **Portables and Portapaks** Are students being accommodated in permanent facilities and is the use of portable classrooms minimized in the proposed options?
- Balance of overall enrolment Is student access to programs, resources and extracurricular opportunities being maximized? Is over and underutilization of buildings avoided to the extent possible?

Possible criteria could include but is not limited to......

- **Stable, long-term boundaries** -- Do the projections show long term stability and result in avoiding the need for additional boundary changes in the short term?
- **Transportation** -- Does the option demonstrate cost effective transportation?
- **Fiscally Responsible** -- Does the option strive to reduce unnecessary costs?
- **Student Experience** -- Does the option demonstrate an effort to reduce the number of school moves students have experienced? Are cohorts kept together?
- Other -- Any other criteria recommended by the Boundary Review Steering Committee or Boundary Review Committee.
